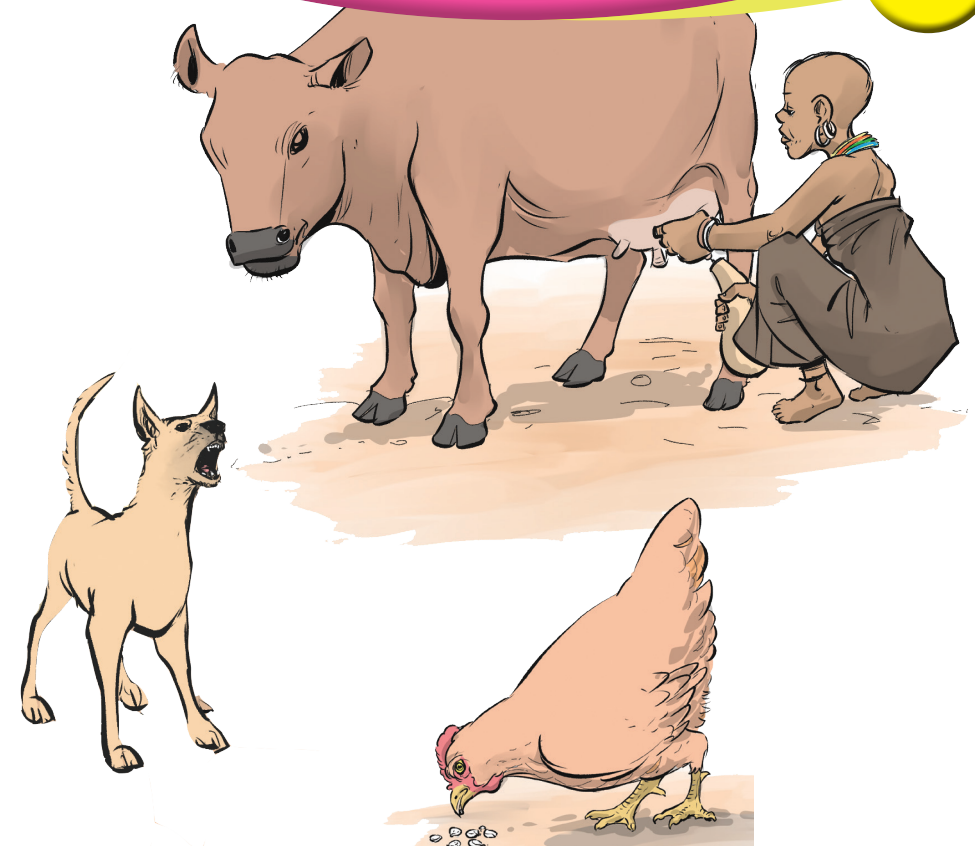

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How to use this book: A guide for family members.

LEVEL 2

This book is a Read@Home book, designed for your child to read and enjoy at home. Read@Home books come in 4 levels:

Book level	Type of reader
1.	Pre-reader
2.	Early reader
3.	Independent reader who still needs some help
4.	Independent reader

This book is LEVEL 2: Early reader.

The best way to use this book is to read it out loud with your child, pronouncing the words carefully, and talking with your child about the pictures. Show the child how to turn the page. Help the child to see how all the pictures and words in the book are about the same topic. Ask your child questions like, “What is your favorite picture in the book? Why?” Encourage the child to “read” (look at) the book on his or her own as well, as often as he or she wishes.
